- Oct 30 Nov 3, 2014: Giant Jamboree! 2500+ attendees are expected to attend the largest event in the history of iGEM and synthetic biology



The iGEM Policy & Practices track aims to stimulate innovative ways of thinking about the policy, economic, social, legal, and philosophical landscape of synthetic biology.

Teams participating in this track are developing skills and tools that will help to prepare synthetic biologists for the world they're working in, and help the world decide how it might best make use of synthetic biology.

Policy & Practices teams are not required to perform laboratory work, and instead will be evaluated according to different criteria.
